FROM THE PASTOR’S DESK . . .

Some notes on funeral arrangements:

Every person is entitled to a Christian burial. This is the fundamental position of our Catholic faith.

For a practicing Catholic this typically means a vigil the night before where Scripture, rosary (prayers) and eulogies are shared. The following day, Mass is prayed for the deceased followed by a graveside service of committal. If circumstances warrant, then the vigil may be omitted, and a Rosary is prayed prior to the start of Mass.

If the person is Catholic but not a member of our parish and/or living out of town, but will be buried in our cemetery, then the funeral Mass is done in the parish where they are living. If the priest or deacon of that parish who does the funeral service will not travel for the burial, then local Catholic clergy can do the graveside service.

If the person is not Catholic or not practicing their Catholic faith, then other options exist, namely a service directly from the funeral home and/or a graveside service. In these situations, Mass may not be appropriate and requires consultation with the pastor.

It is necessary to make all arrangements with the parish directly. The family of the deceased should contact the parish office. If this must be done outside of business hours, then call the rectory (771-3325). Funeral Masses are typically scheduled at 10:00 in the morning.

If you are interested in forming a Legion of Mary group in our parish please contact Father Kirby at the Parish office (771-3425).


The Legion of Mary is the largest apostolic organization of lay people in the Catholic Church, with well over 3 million active members in almost every country of the world. It has been active in the United States since 1931, has been approved by the last six Popes, and was endorsed by the Second Vatican Council.

“The object of the Legion of Mary is the glory of God through the holiness of its members . . .”How does it work? Members meet once a week for an hour and a half for prayer, planning and discussion. Then they are assigned a definite work each week in pairs and under the guidance of their parish priest. Work may include visitation of the sick and homebound, religious education, parishioner visitation, prison ministry, etc.

Active membership is open to all Catholics who faithfully practice their Catholic religion. Auxiliary members commit to pray the Legion prayers, including the Rosary, daily for the intentions of the Blessed Mother.



Readings for July 8: FIFTEENTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME

1st Reading: Amos 7:12-15

Amaziah, priest of Bethel, said to Amos, "Off with you, visionary, flee to the land of Judah! There earn your bread by prophesying, but never again prophesy in Bethel; for it is the king's sanctuary and a royal temple." Amos answered Amaziah, "I was no prophet, nor have I belonged to a company of prophets; I was a shepherd and a dresser of sycamores. The LORD took me from following the flock, and said to me, Go, prophesy to my people Israel."

2nd Reading: Ephesians 1:3-10

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavens, as he chose us in him, before the foundation of the world, to be holy and without blemish before him. In love he destined us for adoption to himself through Jesus Christ, in accord with the favor of his will, for the praise of the glory of God's grace that he granted us in the beloved. In him we have redemption by his blood, the forgiveness of transgressions, in accord with the riches of his grace that he lavished upon us. In all wisdom and insight, he has made known to us the mystery of his will in accord with his favor that he set forth in him as a plan for the fullness of times, to sum up all things in Christ, in heaven and on earth.



Gospel: Mark 6:7-13

Jesus summoned the Twelve and began to send them out two by two and gave them authority over unclean spirits. He instructed them to take nothing for the journey but a walking stick— no food, no sack, no money in their belts. They were, however, to wear sandals but not a second tunic. He said to them, "Wherever you enter a house, stay there until you leave. Whatever place does not welcome you or listen to you, leave there and shake the dust off your feet in testimony against them." So they went off and preached repentance. The Twelve drove out many demons, and they anointed with oil many who were sick and cured them.
