FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK . . .

Today we begin again. This First Sunday of Advent picks up where Christ the King left off. It is a reminder to us that Christ is always with his people.

Advent is a season in which we prepare for the coming of Christ, just as we celebrate his arrival the first time. This means the Advent Season is penitential in nature. It's a perfect time to visit the sacrament of Reconciliation. As you know we have confessions prior to each Sunday service (Confessions must stop at least 15 minutes prior to Mass.) There is also a Penance service on Monday, December 17. Advent requires that we "clean house." Confession is a way to get rid of sin and vices that are not in keeping with the Gospel so that we rid ourselves of anything that prevents us from being in God's company. Therefore we undertake these sacrifices, not with a somber attitude, but with a joyful one.

The Gospel today invites us to be vigilant. Your family Advent wreath will help mark the days of expectation as we witness the lighting and burning of each week's candle. The wreath is an outward sign of our interior journey through these Advent days to draw us closer to the coming of Christ. I pray that we will use this Holy Season to purify our hearts, our minds, and our souls so we can worthily and faithfully stand in the presence of God and each other.

Readings for DECEMBER 9: Second Sunday of Advent

1st Reading: Baruch 5:1-9

Jerusalem, take off your robe of mourning and misery; put on the splendor of glory from God forever: wrapped in the cloak of justice from God, bear on your head the mitre that displays the glory of the eternal name. For God will show all the earth your splendor: you will be named by God forever the peace of justice, the glory of God's worship. Up, Jerusalem! stand upon the heights; look to the east and see your children gathered from the east and the westat the word of the Holy One, rejoicing that they are remembered by God. Led away on foot by their enemies they left you: but God will bring them back to you borne aloft in glory as on royal thrones. For God has commanded that every lofty mountain be made low, and that the age-old depths and gorges be filled to level ground, that Israel may advance secure in the glory of God. The forests and every fragrant kind of tree have overshadowed Israel at God's command; for God is leading Israel in joy by the light of his glory, with his mercy and justice for company.

2nd Reading: Philippians 1:4-7, 8-11

Brothers and sisters: I pray always with joy in my every prayer for all of you, because of your partnership for the gospel from the first day until now. I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work in you will continue to complete it until the day of Christ Jesus. God is my witness, how I long for all of you with the affection of Christ Jesus. And this is my prayer: that your love may increase ever more and more in knowledge and every kind of perception, to discern what is of value, so that you may be pure and blameless for the day of Christ, filled with the fruit of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ for the glory and praise of God.

Gospel: Luke 3:1-6

In the fifteenth year of the reign of Tiberius Caesar, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea, and Herod was tetrarch of Galilee, and his brother Philip tetrarch of the region of Ituraea and Trachonitis, and Lysanias was tetrarch of Abilene, during the high priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John the son of Zechariah in the desert. John went throughout the whole region of the Jordan, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, as it is written in the book of the words of the prophet Isaiah: A voice of one crying out in the desert: "Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths. Every valley shall be filled and every mountain and hill shall be made low. The winding roads shall be made straight, and the rough ways made smooth, and all flesh shall see the salvation of God."
